A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF AMITY, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA FOR THE CONDEMNATION OF LAND OWNED BY JEAN E. CLEMMER, MORE FULLY DESCRIBED IN RECORD BOOK VOLUME 1091, PAGE 0344, THE OWNER OF PROPERTY SITUATE AT 888 OLD AIRPORT ROAD, DOUGLASSVILLE, AMITY TOWNSHIP, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SECOND CLASS TOWNSHIP CODE 53 P.S. 65101 ET SEQ., AND THE EMINENT DOMAIN CODE, 26 P.S. § 1-101 ET SEQ.


WHEREAS, in order to proceed with the expansion of park project, the Township of Amity, Berks County, Pennsylvania (the "Township"), requires the property owned by Jean E. Clemmer, situate 888 Old Airport Road, Douglassville, Amity Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania, more fully described in Record Book Volume 1091, Page 0344 (the "Property"), as more fully described on the Deed attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference.;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, the Board of Supervisors of Amity Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania hereby authorizes the condemnation of the Property for the purposes of the expansion of the park project at the Property, situate at and around 888 Old Airport Road, Douglassville, in the Township of Amity, said improvements to be constructed to serve the residents of the Township, in accordance with the Second Class Township Code 53 P.S. 65101 et seq., and the Eminent Domain Code, 26 P.S. § 1-101 et seq.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, all appropriate actions be taken to carry out the intent and purpose of this resolution, including, but not limited to, the preparation of all appropriate condemnation documents and/or Deed in Lieu of Condemnation by the Township's Solicitor and the filing of all such appropriate condemnation documents and/or Deed in Lieu of Condemnation by the Township's Solicitor.
