May 3, 2017

Call to Order/Pledge to the Flag

Chairperson Kim McGrath called the May 3, 2017 meeting of the Amity Township Board of Supervisors, held at the Township Municipal Building, 2004 Weavertown Road, Douglassville, Berks County, Pennsylvania, to order at 7:00PM. The following were in attendance:

MINUTES

Mr. Gokey moved, seconded by Mr. Hackett to approve the minutes of April 19, 2017. Motion passed 5-0.

FINANCE

Mr. Weller made a motion, seconded by Mr. Jones to approve the disbursements as follows:

- \$ 123,719.00 General Fund
- \$ 47,415.21 Sewer Fund
- \$ 107,306.30 EDU Fund
- \$ 237.00 Liquid Fuels Fund
- \$ 278,677.51 Total

Mrs. McGrath stated a correction was made to the disbursements, making the amount to be approved \$618.00 less than what was shown on the agenda. Motion passed 5-0.

The Board reviewed the Overtime by Department report and had no questions.

REPORTS

Code Department – Mr. Gokey questioned whether bamboo was considered an invasive. Mr. Loomis stated it is considered grass and can't be over ten inches in height. Mr. Gokey stated the Sacks property in Indian Run has a large amount of bamboo growing. Mr. Weller questioned if the remaining 2016 SMO violations have been resolved. Mr. Loomis replied that one remains in violation.

Road Department – Mr. Howell-Clarke reported the listing for the 2002 Ford F250 has almost reached the reserve. The new mower and new Ford F250 are scheduled to arrive next week. Mr. Weller asked if PennDOT notified the Township before placing the yellow arrow and sharp turn signs in front of his residence. Mr. Howell-Clarke stated they do not notify the Township. Mr. Gokey questioned if street sweeping was completed. Mr. Howell-Clarke replied it was finished on April 27th. In regards to the request from a resident for a "no outlet" sign on Queen Anne Circle, Mr. Jones asked if other Township cul-de-sacs have "no outlet" signs. Mr. Howell-Clarke stated they do not. Mr. Loomis stated there is signage on Agata Drive as a result of a request from a resident. The resident requested the signage citing concerns of traffic enters the cul-de-sac as a result of accidents occurring at the intersection of SR422 and Monocacy Creek Road. After discussion on types and sizes of signs, the Board agreed the need for the sign was warranted. Mr. Bingaman asked if the Board would like signs placed in all cul-de-sacs. Mr. Weller stated he didn't feel it was necessary if drivers can clearly see the cul-de-sac before entering it.

Waste Water Treatment Plant – Mr. Weller asked if the recent rain caused any issues at the plant. Mr. Wheeler replied that there were no issues. Mr. Jones questioned if the I&I project was completed. Mr. Wheeler reported it was completed and there were no issues.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS – None

SOLICITOR'S REPORT

Mr. Boland requested a brief executive session to discuss developments related to the *Montague Easement* for the Leaf Creek Interceptor. Mr. Boland reported the *DTE Energy* has filed for the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission filing and requested a Municipal Land Use letter as the project for the *gas pipeline* to feed the power plant in Birdsboro proceeds. *D. Keith Dixon*, 639 Old Airport Road, was given notice that the *civil action lawsuit* against the Amity Township Board of Supervisors was being terminated. Mr. Dixon filed an appeal, which was denied by the Courts of Common Pleas. Mr. Boland stated he will be submitting Summary Judgement Motion to have the case dismissed and anticipates the hearing will be scheduled within the next 60 days.

NEW BUSINESS

ZHB Recommendation, David O. Fisher — Christopher Mullaney, Mullaney Law Offices, appeared representing Mr. Fisher. Mr. Mullaney stated the property located at 1392 East Ben Franklin Highway has been operating as non-conforming uses for years as a gas station, auto repair shop, storage and fuel tank location. Mr. Mullaney stated his applicant applied for variances for an enlargement of the pre-existing non-conforming use, uses permitted by right, change of uses for non-conforming structures, and side and rear yard setbacks. Mr. Fisher gave this account for uses at the property: the gas station is vacant; two men rent one modular for storage of contents from bank repossessed homes; a second modular has overflow storage from the block building on the premises and has a desk and chair that is used at times by the tenant; and the box truck is used buy Shred One to store shredded paper. Mr. Loomis stated the structures were added without application of zoning

and building permits. Mr. Mullaney confirmed the same. Mrs. McGrath stated permits couldn't be issued with the unresolved use and setback issues identified. Mr. Loomis stated the applicant applied for the ZHB hearing after being notified of violations as a result of a complaint from a resident that a building encroached on an adjacent property and was using bathroom facilities without proper connection and certificates of occupancy. After lengthy discussion, Mrs. McGrath recommended the applicant be prepared to provide specifics of proposed setbacks and future uses are planned for this site when they appear before the ZHB. The Board chose not to make a formal recommendation in support or against the variances requested, due to the ambiguity of the application.

Fund Balance Policy Amendments — Mr. Bingaman recommended adopting an amended Fund Balance Policy to clarify that the Budget Stabilization Balance is part of the General Fund and the Capital Reserve Fund is a stand-alone fund to satisfy concerns raised by the Auditors. Mr. Weller moved, seconded by Mr. Jones to adopt the Fund Policy Amendments. Motion passed 5-0.

EMPLOYEE/OFFICIAL REPORTS

MANAGER'S REPORT:

Proposed Elimination of the Per Capita Tax – Daniel Boone School District President notified Amity and Union Townships and Birdsboro Borough about the District Finance Committee's proposal to eliminate the Per Capita Tax. Mr. Bingaman stated the Township receives approximately \$40K from this tax, and those revenues would need to be generated elsewhere and asked for comments. After discussion, Mr. Jones moved, seconded by Mr. Weller to authorize the Manager to send a letter expressing the Board of Supervisors' opposition to the elimination of the Per Capita Tax. Motion passed 5-0.

Cable Franchise Renewal Meeting – Municipalities participating in the Cable Franchise Consortium met on April 20th. It was discussed that a public hearing with a stenographic record will be required. A joint meeting could be held with Amity, Birdsboro and Exeter, saving on advertising costs. The Board had no objections to the Manager reaching out to determine if there would be interest in holding a joint meeting.

Parks and Recreation Meeting – The Parks & Recreation meeting held on Sunday, April 30th began at Amity Community Park (ACP), followed by Lake Drive. While at ACP, the Optimist Club proposed holding the second Annual Tree Lighting at the park. They would like to plant a tree to the left of the macadam path off Weavertown Road. Barry Leier stated electric would be installed to a pole and paid for by PA American Water. Groth Tree Farm will be donating a 12 to 14 foot Norway Spruce. Groth agreed to deliver and place the tree in the hole. Mr. Howell-Clarke stated the road crew could dig the hole and use their 250-gallon tank to water the tree as needed. Curt Clifford stated last year's event went very well, filling Redner's parking lot. Mr. Clifford stated there is a sickly Maple tree where they want to plant the new tree. Mr. Jones moved, seconded by Mr. Hackett to authorize the Optimist Club to coordinate the project with the Manager. Motion passed 5-0. Phyllis Cooper, Limekiln Road, asked if parking would be a concern, considering the event filled the Redner's parking lot last year. Mr. Leier stated parking spaces at the park, school, church and Township building could be utilized.

Shirey Turkey Farm – Mr. Bingaman received the Letter of Credit, and the Financial Security, Stormwater Maintenance and Municipal Improvements Agreements. The documents are ready for the Chairperson and Secretary to execute and plans could be released with Mr. Boland's consent. Mr. Boland had no objections.

Sale of Truck #66 – Mr. Bingman stated the auction for Truck #66 will end on Friday and requested permission to accept the highest bid for the 2002 Ford F250. Mr. Gokey moved, seconded by Mr. Jones to authorize the Manager to accept the highest bid on Municibid. Motion passed 5-0.

Draft of Ordinance Amendments – Mr. Bignaman distributed a draft of an Ordinance amending sections of the code related to restoration for street openings, unregistered vehicles in front and rear yards, and penalties for sewer payments. Penalties for sewer billing will be more clearly defined with this amendment, as well as an additional 90-day penalty that will be applied to the entire principal of the balance. Mr. Loomis stated the current code allows for one unregistered vehicle on a property. Mr. Gokey stated the change was to prevent residents from placing a vehicle in a front yard and leaving it there. Mrs. McGrath asked if the Ordinance could be amended to prohibit storage of vehicles that are registered to non-residents. Mr. Boland agreed the amendment could address that issue. Mr. Jones asked if this amendment would address the concerns of a resident on Blacksmith Road who is storing multiple vehicles while repairing them on his property. Mr. Loomis stated this amendment would not, stating his recommendation would be to deal separately with that issue. After further discussion, Mr. Boland will provide a revision of the draft for the next meeting. Mr. Bingaman stated he will be asking for permission to advertise for adoption of the amendments at the May 17th meeting.

Mr. Bingaman requested an executive session for personnel matters.

CHIEF OF POLICE:

Chief Kensey stated he'd like to replace 26-4, a Dodge Charger with 101,150 miles. The Dodge has a larger motor, using more gas and is not all-wheel-drive. The Chief obtained a quote for a 2017 Ford Taurus Police Interceptor from Hondru Ford and asked the Board for their consideration of using funds from the Capital Fund to purchase the vehicle in 2017 instead of waiting until 2018. Chief Kensey allocated \$10K for cell upgrades and \$25K for floor repairs in his budget for the Capital Fund and was willing to wait for those renovations in lieu of purchasing a vehicle. The complete cost of the vehicle with paint, upfitting and decal was \$34,780.00. Mr. Jones stated Ford has indicated they will be increasing purchase prices by approximately \$2K. Mr. Bingaman confirmed the Capital Fund has money to cover the cost of the vehicle; and \$35K was set aside for the renovations. The Board was not opposed to purchasing the vehicle in 2017 from the Capital Fund. A motion was not made to authorize the purchase. Mrs. McGrath asked how many days were represented in the Law Enforcement and Service Issues part of the Chief's report. Chief Kensey stated it's the timeframe between BOS meetings; approximately 14 days. Mrs. McGrath questioned if the number of parking violations and traffic citations were indicative of other 14-day periods. Chief Kensey stated the parking violations were a result of vehicles not moving for street sweeping; typically, there are very few parking violations and traffic citations issued. Mrs. McGrath suggested with the number of officers on duty each day there could be a potential for additional enforcement. Chief Kensey stated he has obtained two window tint meters from a company at no charge, in exchange for 60-days' worth of data for vehicles stopped and tested with the meters. Mrs. McGrath questioned how many vehicles needed to be stopped. The Chief said there was no specific criteria given.

Chief Kensey requested a brief executive session to discuss personnel matters.





ACTIONS NEEDED

1. Dollar General –

a. Preliminary/Final Plan Approval

Dollar General-Steckbeck Engineering-Commercial Business Rt 422

Michael Swank, Steckbeck Engineering stated they are currently working with Kozloff Stout's office to resolve the vacation of the road right of way to Lot 2. Mr. Swank asked to be able to record the plan showing the vacated land. Mr. Weber stated the plan recorded needs to show the current deed. Mr. Swank agreed to prepare the plan with the original Right-of-Way and Mr. Icovella can record the residue lot at a later date showing the vacated land after all conditions are met with the Ordinance. As requested by the Township, LTL Consultants has reviewed the above referenced plan for conformance with Amity Township ordinances. The plan proposes the subdivision of a 2.0 acre property located at the northwest corner of Route 422 and North Monocacy Creek Road into two lots as follows: Lot 1 - 1.16 acre to be developed for a 9100 SF Dollar General store and Lot 2 -Residue Lot 0.84 acres with no proposed development at this time. The plan also shows the annexation of a 0.19 acre tract from Amity Township to be adjoined to Lot 2 – Residue. The plan also contains the land development improvements for Lot 1.

Information submitted for review consists of a plan set with 25 sheets with an original date of December 9, 2016 and a last revised date of April 25, 2017 prepared by Steckbeck Engineering and Surveying, Inc.

The following comments are offered for your consideration:

CONFORMANCE WITH THE ZONING ORDINANCE

- The property is located in the HC-Highway Commercial Zoning District. The retail use 1. proposed for Lot 1 is an allowed use by Section 405(b)(11).
- 2. The Applicant obtained a variance to allow 64% impervious area on Lot 1. Section 405(d) allows a maximum impervious area of 60%.
- 3. The Applicant obtained a variance to allow 30 parking spaces on Lot 1. Section 924(c)(4) requires 61 parking spaces for a 9100 SF retail building.

4. The Applicant obtained a variance to allow up to 160 SF of signage with at least 50% of such signage being building signs. Section 527(g)(2)(i) allows total signage of 140 SF for the proposed use. It should be noted however, that the plan states only 129.5 SF of signage is proposed.

<u>CONFORMANCE WITH THE SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT</u> <u>ORDINANCE</u>

- 1. The plan was submitted as a preliminary/final plan. The Applicant obtained a waiver to allow the plan to be processed as a preliminary/final plan.
- 2. All plan certification statements on Sheets 1 and 21 must be properly executed (Section 403(c)(11-13)).
- 3. The following comments pertain to the proposed easements shown on the plan (Sheet 4) (Section 403(d)(3)):
 - a) Proof of acquisition of the proposed easements on the adjoining Hope United Methodist Church will be required.
 - b) Appropriate agreements for each easement must be reviewed and approved by the Township Solicitor.
- 4. Sheet 3 Subdivision Plan now depicts the annexation of a portion of the property owned by Amity Township (labeled as Lot Addition A) to Lot 2 Residue. The parcel shown as Lot Addition A must be created via vacation prior to annexing it to Lot 2 Residue. The plan cannot be approved as currently shown until Lot Addition A is created by the vacation process. (Section 403(d)(4).
- 5. The sanitary sewer facilities associated with this plan were reviewed by the Township sewer engineer (Entech letter dated 12/13/16) and were found to be satisfactory (Section 514).
- 6. The public water service facilities associated were reviewed and approved by the PA American Water Company (email from Craig B. Derosh dated 3/13/17) (Section 515(b)).
- 7. The plan was reviewed by the Township Fire Marshal (letter dated 2/13/17) for fire fighting and emergency access issues associated with the plan (Section 515(e)). The Fire Marshal had no comments.
- 8. In accordance with Section 519 (c)(12) a minimum of 0.0546 acres of land shall be offered to Amity Township for open space and recreation as part of this project. In lieu of dedication of such land, a fee of \$4095 shall be paid to Amity Township prior to final approval of the subdivision/land development plan.
- 9. A Municipal Improvements Agreement and Financial Security Agreement must be executed for this project. An improvements cost estimate has been submitted to LTL. The form of the agreement will be provided by the Solicitor.

CONFORMANCE WITH THE STORMWATER MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE

- 1. Section 303(c) An erosion and sedimentation control plan must be submitted to and be approved by the Berks County Conservation District for this project.
- 2. Section 303(c) An NPDES Construction Activities permit must be obtained from PADEP for this project.
- 3. Section 703 An Operations and Maintenance Agreement for the stormwater management facilities must be prepared and executed for this project. The Applicant should contact the Solicitor for the form of the agreement.
- 4. Section 706 The Applicant will be required to provide payment of \$5,000.00 to the Township Stormwater Control and BMP Operation and Maintenance Fund prior to final plan approval.

As requested by the Township, LTL Consultants has reviewed the above referenced plan for conformance with Amity Township ordinances. The plan proposes the consolidation of two properties listed on the plan as Premises A (approx 0.65 acres) and Premises B (approx 6.65 acres), the resubdivision of the consolidated lot into two lots (Lot A 1.46 acres and Lot B 5.84 acres) and the development of Lot A consisting of a 7381 SF Auto Zone building with associated parking, access drives and stormwater management facilities. The plan shows a conceptual future layout of Lot B. A separate land development plan will be submitted for Phase 2 (Lot B) at a future time. The properties are located at 1111 E. Ben Franklin Highway (Premises A) and 1123 E. Ben Franklin Highway (Premises B). The combined tract has frontage on both eastbound and westbound Ben Franklin Highway and the plan proposes driveway ingress/egress on both directions of Ben Franklin Highway.

Information submitted for review consists of a plan set with 19 sheets with an original date of January 4, 2017 and a last revised date of April 25, 2017 and a Stormwater Management Report with a last revised date of April 25, 2017 both prepared by Penn E & R, Inc.

The following comments are offered for your consideration:

CONFORMANCE WITH THE ZONING ORDINANCE

- 1. The following variances were granted for this project by the Zoning Hearing Board on April 17, 2017. These variances all pertain to Lot A/Phase 1.
 - Section 924(b)(1) reducing the size of certain parking spaces from 10' x 20' to 10' x 18'.

- Section 924(c)(4) reducing the number of required parking spaces from 49 to 25.
- Section 927(g)(1)(ii) increasing the total area of signage on the property to 302 square feet.
- Section 405(d) permitting the application of zoning criteria applicable to properties with public or community water and sewage, during the temporary period when an on-lot well for the use will be utilized.
- Section 405(d) to allow for a reduction of the improvement buffer setback, from 10' to 0' for the internal boundary created between proposed Lots A and B.

When available, the written Decision and Order from the Zoning Hearing Board should be listed on Sheet I.

2. The properties are located in the HC-Highway Commercial Zoning District. The proposed retail (auto parts sales) use of the property is a permitted use (Section 405(b)(11).

<u>CONFORMANCE</u> WITH THE SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE

- 1. The plan title must be amended to identify the plan as a Preliminary Subdivision and Land Development Plan on Sheet 1, on each title block and in the Township certificates for approval (Section 402(b)(1)).
- 2. Now that the project will contain two separate lots, the ownership structure of the lots and the need for cross easements must be discussed (Section 402(d)(3)).
- 3. The following comments pertain to the Lot Consolidation and Subdivision Plan (Sheet 3):
 - a) The parcel areas listed on the plan do not agree with the parcel areas listed in the Areas note on the plan for the existing parcels and consolidated lot. It appears some areas are listed to the title line and others to various right-of-way lines. This must be resolved by listing all areas for the existing parcels to the same reference (Section 402(d)(4)).
 - b) The proposed areas of Lots A and B should be listed to the title line and to the appropriate right-of-way line (Section 402(d)(4)).
 - c) The new lot boundary lines for proposed Lots A and B should be shown in a heavier line weight and must have metes and bounds descriptions exclusive to each individual lot. The metes and bounds for the proposed lot boundaries should also be shown in heavier text. (Section 402(d)(4))
 - d) Concrete monuments must be shown at each new lot corner for proposed Lots A and B that do not fall within a paved area (Section 402(d)(9)).
- 4. An erosion and sediment control plan must be submitted to and be approved by the Berks County Conservation District prior to final plan approval by Amity Township (Sections 402(e)(5) and 403(e)(5)). An NPDES permit for construction activities must also be obtained from PADEP for this project.

- 5. Permits must be obtained from PennDOT for the proposed site driveways as well as any utility work proposed in the PennDOT right-of-way. When obtained, permit numbers must be added to the plan. (Section 402(e)(7))
- 6. In accordance with the trip generation report prepared by TPD, the Phase 1 use will generate 25 new weekday, peak PM hour trips. Therefore, a traffic impact fee of \$17,628 (\$705.12 x 25) must be paid to Amity Township prior to the issuance of a building permit for the building in Phase 1. A note must be added to the plan stating that a traffic impact fee of \$17,628 must be paid to Amity Township prior to the issuance of a building permit. (Section 505(b))
- 7. Consideration should be given in the design and construction of Phase 1 of an accessible pedestrian pathway which will connect the phases when Phase 2 is built (Section 507(b)(5) & Section 510(c)).
- 8. In accordance with Section 510(b), parking areas with 50 or more spaces shall be designed with an internal collector road which does not directly access parking spaces. Such internal collector road has not been provided. A waiver request is listed on Sheet 1.
- 9. In accordance with Section 510(i)(2), the edge of parking spaces shall be at least 15 feet to the nearest building. The plan proposes a separation of only 8 feet. A waiver request is listed on Sheet 1.
- 10. In accordance with Section 510(i)(3), concrete tire bumpers shall be installed to prevent vehicle overhang across sidewalks. The plan does not show tire bumpers and a waiver request is listed on Sheet 1. The plan does propose a bollard at each parking space adjacent to the sidewalk.
- 11. Details with spot elevations should be provided for the ADA parking spaces, ramps and sidewalks to demonstrate compliance with ADA specifications. The entrance to the building should also be shown on the plan. (Section 510(i)(4))
- 12. It must be confirmed that the Applicant has purchased the required EDUs for this project. (Section 514) The sanitary sewer connection shown on Sheet 6 will require an H.O.P. from PennDOT.
- 13. The following comments pertain to the proposed landscape plan (Sheet #8) (Phase 1 only) in accordance with Section 517:
 - a) Some of the text is light and difficult to read on Sheet #8.
 - b) The landscape maintenance note listed in Section 517(i)(2)(iv) must be added to the plan.
- 14. In accordance with Section 519(c)(12), a minimum of 0.044286 acres of land shall be offered to Amity Township for open space and recreation as part of Phase 1 of this project. In lieu of dedication of such land, a fee of \$3321.45 shall be paid to Amity Township prior to final approval of the land development plan. The choice of land or fee shall be at the discretion of the Township (Section 519(f)(1)).

- 15. The following comments pertain to the proposed lighting plan in accordance with Section 520:
 - a) The proposed illumination levels shown on a 10' x 10' grid pattern must be shown on the plan (Section 520 (g)(2)(ii)).

For Endwall #7, the type of endwall (Type D) shall be labeled. On page 39 of the Post Construction Stormwater Management Report, the pipe length and pipe slope for the Infiltration Basin outlet pipe shall be revised to match Sheet 9.

For the Detention Basin, a profile view of Detention Basin to Outfall has been provided on Sheet 10. Outlet Structure #9 shall be labeled. On page 42 of the Post Construction Stormwater Management Report, the pipe length and pipe slope for the Detention Basin outlet pipe shall be revised to match Sheet 10.

- 7. Section 311(b)(vi) On Sheet 15, the Proposed Trash Rack for Detention Basin Detail shall be revised to provide a minimum width of 6" and a minimum depth of 6" for the proposed trash rack. Clarify if the trash rack will be installed on the upstream end of Endwall #7 or on the inside of Outlet Structure #6. - 8. Section 311(b)(xi) For the Phase I Infiltration Basin and the Detention Basin, the emergency spillway lining shall extend to the toe of slope (outside of basin). On Sheet 6, the proposed spillway lining for the Phase I Infiltration Basin and the proposed spillway lining for the Detention Basin shall be revised.
 - For the Phase I Infiltration Basin, a profile view of Infiltration Basin to Detention Basin has been provided on Sheet 9. The spillway lining shall be delineated on the profile view. For the Detention Basin, a profile view of Detention Basin to Outfall has been provided on Sheet 10. The spillway lining shall be delineated on the profile view.
- 9. Section 311(b)(xiii) For the Phase I Infiltration Basin, a profile view of Infiltration Basin to Detention Basin has been provided on Sheet 9. The Infiltration Basin outlet pipe shows 4 anti-seep collars. On Sheet 13, Standard Construction Detail #7-16 lists 3 anti-seep collars for the Infiltration Basin outlet pipe. Please clarify.
- 10. Section 311(b)(xv) On Sheet 6, the rip rap apron on the downstream end of Endwall #8 is required to be installed on a flat surface.
- 11. Section 311(b)(xviii) On Sheet 6, the downstream end of pipe run Outlet Structure #9 to Endwall #8 shall discharge at the toe of the slope.
- 12. Section 311(b)(xviii) On Sheet 15, the basin outlet pipe information (24" RCP @ 5.07%) listed in the Detention Basin Outlet Control Structure Detail does not match the profile view of Detention Basin to Outfall on Sheet 10. On Sheet 15, the basin outlet pipe information (24" RCP @ 5.65%) listed in the Surface Infiltration Basin Outlet Control Structure Detail does not match the profile view of Infiltration Basin to Detention Basin to Outfall on Sheet 9. On Sheet 15, the Surface Infiltration Basin Outlet Control Structure Detail shall be revised to list a pipe slope of 0.17% for pipe run Endwall #7 to Outlet Structure #6.

For Outlet Structure #6, provide a construction detail to delineate how the weir wall will be installed on the inside of the inlet box.

13. Section 311(b)(xx) - On Sheet 18, the location of the meadow wetland seed mix in the bottom of the Phase I Infiltration Basin shall be delineated.

Section 312(c) – On Sheet 6, the proposed trench drain label shall be revised to list "Elev." in lieu of "Length" in 4 locations. On Sheet 6, verify the grate elevations listed in the proposed trench drain label. As per the proposed contours on Sheet 6, the grate elevation (east) appears to be less than elevation 185.

- 14. Section 312(i) Provide a construction details for a D-Endwall, Inlet Box, Bicycle Safe Grates and Inlet Box Top Units. These 4 construction details were previously provided on Sheet 12 (Sheet 17 on last set of plans) and shall be replaced.
- 15. Section 703 An Operations and Maintenance Agreement for the stormwater management facilities must be prepared and executed for this project.
- 16. Section 706 The Applicant will be required to provide payment of \$5,000 to the Township Stormwater Control and BMP Operation and Maintenance Fund prior to final plan approval.

As requested by the Township, LTL Consultants has reviewed the above referenced plan for conformance with Amity Township ordinances. The plan proposes further development of the 24.36 acre American Crane/O. Norheim Corporation property located at 531 Old Swede Road. The plan proposes a 39,400 SF manufacturing building, an exterior overhead crane, access drives, a turnaround area for large cranes and associated stormwater management facilities.

Please note that the majority of the aspects of this plan, with the exception of the proposed building and parking adjacent to the building, were reviewed and approved via the Amity Township in-house review process in 2016. An erosion and sediment control plan and an NPDES permit have been approved for this project.

Information submitted for review consists of a plan set with ten sheets prepared by Boyer Engineering, LLC dated April 1, 2017.

The following comments are offered for your consideration.

CONFORMANCE WITH THE ZONING ORDINANCE

The property is located in the LI/O – Light Industrial/Office Zoning District. Please note that a variance was granted by the Amity Township Zoning Hearing Board on 2/22/17 to allow a building height of 120' for this project. The plan complies with the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance.

CONFORMANCE WITH THE SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT PLAN

- 1. The plan was submitted as a preliminary/final plan. A waiver of the requirements of Section 304-Preliminary Plan will be required to process the plan as a preliminary/final plan. The plan was reviewed for preliminary and final plan requirements.
- 2. The Cover Sheet (Sheet #1) should identify the plan as a preliminary/final plan (Section 403(b)(1)).
- 3. The tax parcel number listed in General Note #1 on the Cover Sheet is not correct. The correct tax parcel number is 24536407596157. (Section 403(b)(4))
- 4. The name of all adjoining record owners, with the deed book volume and page number where recorded must be added to the plan (Section 403(b)(6)).
- 5. All plan certification statements on Sheets 1 and 5 must be properly executed (Section 403(b)(11-13)).
- 6. The Township Sewer Engineer should review this plan to determine if sewage facilities planning and/or additional EDUs are required for this project (Section 403(e)(10)).
- 7. Schematic exterior architectural drawings of the proposed building should be submitted for review (Section 403(e)(12)).
- 8. A trip generation report must be submitted for this project to determine the number of new peak PM hours trips to be generated by the project. The appropriate traffic impact fee will be calculated based upon the trip generation. (Section 505)
- 9. The sanitary sewer aspects of the plan must be reviewed and approved by the Township Sewer Engineer (Section 514).
- 10. The public water supply facilities associated with this plan must be reviewed and approved by the Pennsylvania-American Water Company (Section 515).
- 11. The plan must be reviewed by the Amity Township Fire Marshall for fire fighting and emergency access issues associated with the plan (Section 515(e)).
- 12. In accordance with Section 519(c)(12) a minimum of 0.2364 acres of land shall be offered to Amity Township for open space and recreation as part of this project. In lieu of dedication of such land, a fee of \$17,730.00 shall be paid to Amity Township prior to final approval of the land development plan.
- 13. Any proposed outdoor lighting associated with this plan should be shown on the plan (Section 520).
- 14. A Municipal Improvements Agreement and Financial Security Agreement must be executed for this project (Section 601). The status of the agreements drafted for the 2016 Site Plan should be reviewed to determine action needed.

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Amity, Berks County, Pennsylvania, it is necessary and desirable to vacate a certain portion of road known as Monocacy Road (Township Route T727 from the lands of Hope United Methodist Church of Douglassville, known as 117 N. Monocacy Creek Road, with a Property ID 24535411760082 to Pennsylvania State Highway Benjamin Franklin Highway containing in area 7,401 square feet in the Township of Amity; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Section 2304 of the Pennsylvania Second Class Township Code, as amended, the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Amity has the power to vacate roads within the Township; and

A certain portion of road known as North Monocacy Creek Road (Township Route T727) from the lands of Hope United Methodist Church of Douglassville, known as 117 North Monocacy Creek Road, with a Property ID 24535411760082 to Pennsylvania State Highway Benjamin Franklin Highway containing in area 7,401 square feet in the Township of Amity, as more fully depicted on plan as attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and the legal description attached hereto as Exhibit "B," incorporated herein by reference thereto, is hereby vacated as a public road.

Section 2. The official map of the Township of Amity is hereby amended to reflect the vacation of that certain portion of road known as North Monocacy Creek Road in the Township of Amity, as specified in Section 1 above.

Section 3. Notwithstanding the vacation by the Township of Amity specified in Sections 1 and 2 above, all easements heretofore granted over, through, across and under the real properties comprising that portion of North Monocacy Creek Road being vacated pursuant to Sections 1 and 2 above shall be maintained and all rights pertaining thereto shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. If any sentence, clause, section or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Amity that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as they are inconsistent with this Ordinance.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days from the date of enactment.



TOWNSHIP MANAGER'S REPORT

- 1. Pension Committee: The Pension Committee met last week to review the results of the first quarter. The returns through March 31st were as follows: Non-Uniformed Employee's Plan 3.76% and Police Pension Plan 3.73%. Since inception, those returns have been 6.72% and 6.84%, respectively. Our investment policy was 70% Equities / 30% Bonds. Our financial advisors from BB&T recommended the Committee modify the investment policy to 75% / 25% due to Bonds not performing as well in a rising interest rate. The actual policy states a range, allowing flexibility. The Committee agreed to make the Policy change. Our next meeting will be in November.
- 2. Proposed Per Capita Tax Elimination: I attended the School Board meeting on Monday, May 8th. After a brief discussion, the Board members decided to table the elimination of Per Capita. It seems they did not have all of the facts needed to make a determination and had not really thought of it as a potential tax increase if they roll it into the real estate millage. In the end, it seems they may look to have Amity & Birdsboro share in the cost of their in-house administration of maintaining the taxable database and the collection & distribution of the tax. One Board member referred to a possible change in Act 32, in which, they would roll up the Act 511 taxes into the County collector's responsibility. There were a lot of references to letting the "new Board" handle it (5 of the 9 seats up with several existing members not running). We all agreed to have further dialogue before any changes are made.
- 3. <u>Xpress Bill Pay:</u> Last year, when we upgraded our financial software, we discussed the possibility of adding a feature to allow our residents to pay their sewer bills via credit card through an on-line portal. We budgeted in 2017 to add this feature. Xpress Bill Pay will allow a customer to log in and view & manage

their bill/account. They will have the ability to setup an auto-pay method and opt to go paperless (they would receive an email that their e-bill is available). The more customers who select this option, the more we can save. The initial set-up and training will cost \$4,500 (again, already factored into our budget). There will be ongoing monthly fees of \$166 and a small percentage in gateway and merchant fees. We believe this feature will be a welcome one and will ultimately save the Township time and money. Stay tuned for implementation – ultimately, there will be a link from the Township website, directing customers to the portal.

- 4. SharePoint Electronic Filing System: Also factored into the budget is a new product/process to electronically file our documents (see the Benefits identified on the attached proposal). I have been struggling significantly with the mounds of paper in this building; and, would ultimately like to get us nearly paperless. This will also give us the ability to organize documents and create workspaces for each meeting in essence, you can look at it as an electronic filing cabinet that you will be able to access from home as well as during meetings. SharePoint is an add-on to Microsoft Office 365. We will pay a small monthly fee to add this feature onto our existing licenses (\$5 ea.) The main expense of this process is to purchase desktop scanners and software to implement this process. There is also a professional services piece to configure the site and train the users. The total cost of the equipment, software and professional services is \$21,132 through Stratix Systems. We have budgeted \$20,000 in the Capital Fund and the remainder would come out of the Networked Computer line item. I would ask for consideration to approve this purchase.
- 5. <u>Lake Drive Park:</u> Bids are due Friday. Mr. Weber will provide a list of the bids and the paperwork for review of the Solicitor. We hope to be in a position to recommend award Wednesday evening.
- 6. <u>Banking:</u> Our recommendation is to continue our relationship with Fulton Bank. They have provided the best interest rate option even when we factor in the fees that we pay. We are still evaluating credit card options and a P-Card solution.
- 7. MS4 Program: As you are likely aware, MS4 responsibilities are a burdensome, unfunded mandate on local governments. It came to my attention after a meeting with LTL, that Amity has not filed required annual reports for a few years. In addition, the Township is required to file for a new permit by September of 2017. In order to comply with these deadlines, I have requested that LTL get us where we need to be. Linda Cluck of LTL has been working diligently to get our map up to speed as well as our annual report and new permit application moving forward. Unfortunately, this will be costing the township a considerable amount of money and will be an on-going expense we will need to factor into future budgets. We will need to begin to discuss storm water topics/issues at meetings; and, will be required to hold a public hearing (June/July) prior to filing our application for our new MS4 permit.

- 8. <u>Penn DOT / RATS Proposed Traffic Improvements:</u> Just to keep you up to speed, I am following proposed traffic improvements Penn DOT has in various stages. They are as follows:
 - A) Box Culvert Replacement Weavertown Road (McCormick Taylor states the work will take place between <u>March</u> and July of 2017)
 - B) Route 422/Benjamin Franklin Hwy Paving, curb cut, base repair, milling & overlay from Ada Drive in Exeter to SR 662 in Amity (let date proposed for Aug. 1st I've noticed some centerline paving perhaps the project is starting)
 - C) Mill Race / Main Street Bridge Replacement (let date proposed for April 20, 2017)
 - D) SR 562 Bridge Replacement over Manatawny Creek (let date proposed for Sept. 14, 2017)
 - E) Blacksmith Road Bridge (Super structure only) Replacement over Manatawny Creek (let date proposed for Nov. 2, 2017 with construction proposed for early 2018).
