
Consumer fireworks cannot be intentionally ignited or discharged:





If your recycling pickup is missed by J.P. Mascaro, please make sure you call the Township office as soon as possible at 610-953-0016. Do not call J.P. Mascaro directly. We will reach out on your behalf to J.P. Mascaro to get the recycling picked up.

If you do not have a blue Township recycling bin, you can pick one up at the Township building at NO COST. The bins are located across from the Township building near our road garage.

# - NO SOLICITING without a permit

Companies wishing to solicit in Amity Township must make an application to the Police Department and include a copy of a background check and driver's license for each individual who will be soliciting on their behalf.

Upon approval, Amity Township Police issue a Soliciting/Peddling Permit to each individual, which shows their name, the name of the company they are soliciting for and the expiration date.

The permit should always be kept on their person and should be furnished, upon request to all Police officers, Township Officials, and citizens. If you're not sure if someone should be soliciting, you can ask to see their permit, check the Township website, or call 610-655-4911 and ask to speak to an Officer.

Soliciting/peddling is only permitted Monday through Saturday, from 9am until 5pm and <u>NEVER</u> on Sundays. Soliciting/peddling is also not permitted on properties that are posted with "No Soliciting" signs, regardless of whether they have a permit to do so.

# UNREGISTERED & INOPERABLE VEHICLES IN AMITY TOWNSHIP.

In Amity Township it is illegal to have an unregistered or inoperable vehicle on private property unless it is stored in a garage. Major vehicle repairs are not permitted unless done in a garage. No vehicle may be parked in the grass at any time. Fines can be up to \$1000 a day plus court costs.



302.8 Motor Vehicles: Except as provided for in other regulations, inoperable and unregistered motor vehicles shall not be parked, kept or stored on any premises, and vehicles shall not at any time be in a state of major disassembly, disrepair, or in the process of being stripped or dismantled. Painting of vehicles is prohibited unless conducted inside an approved spray booth.

Exception: A vehicle of any type is permitted to undergo major overhaul, including body work, provided that such work is performed inside a structure or similarly enclosed area designed and approved for such purposes.

302.8.1: Motor vehicles may only be parked on a paved area (as that term is defined in the Amity Township Zoning Ordinance §32-302).

Inoperable Motor Vehicle: A vehicle that cannot be driven upon the public streets for reasons including, but not limited to, being wrecked, abandoned, in a state of disrepair, or incapable of being moved under its own power.

Be advised our yard waste site is undergoing change and there is more to come. Please follow the signage and direction printed on the photo below. Please do not drop off grass clippings, lumber, rocks, metal, large trees and stumps. etc. Brush, shrubs, tree branches and leaf waste is permissible.

The site is for Township residents ONLY.







# PETS IN THE HEAT

It's getting hot, hot, and warm weather doesn't just affect us humans!

High temperatures can cause serious health problems for our pets if we don't keep them cool.

Follow these tips to keep pets safe this summer.



Don't leave your pet in the car, even on mild days. Vehicle interiors heat up dangerously quickly when the sun is out.



Beware hot pavement on sensitive toes. Check pavement temperature with the palm of your hand before taking your pup for a walk.

Don't shave all their hair off! It may seem like a good idea to give your pet a drastic new 'do, but their hair actually helps keep them cool by protecting them from the sun's rays.



Provide plenty of water at all times. Pets need to stay hydrated just like we do, and that need for water becomes more critical in the heat.



Don't over-exercise.

Physical exertion is more taxing when it's warm.

Let your pet take it slow.

Lightning Safety



WHEN THUNDER ROARS, GO INDOORS.

Stay inside until 30 minutes after the rumble of thunder.



# SAFE

The metal shell of hard-topped metal vehicles does provide protection to those inside a vehicle with the windows closed.

# NOT SAFE

or in a wide-open space is extremely dangerous.

#### What You Need to Know

- NO PLACE outside is safe when thunderstorms are in the area!
- If you can hear thunder, you are close enough to a storm to be in danger of being struck by lightning. Lightning can travel 10 to 12 miles from a thunderstorm.
- When you hear thunder, immediately move to a safe shelter: a substantial building with electricity or plumbing or an enclosed, metal-topped vehicle with windows up.
- Do you know what to do if you receive a thunderstorm watch or thunderstorm warning?Visit www.ready.pa.gov to find out!

#### Last Resort: Outdoor Risk Reduction Tips

- . Keep moving towards a safe shelter. If you are caught out in the open, do not stop.
- Avoid open fields, hills, rocky outcrops, and ridge tops. Do not lie flat on the ground.
- Avoid bodies of water and metal objects which can conduct electricity.

#### Outdoor Lightning Safety

- Seek Shelter Immediately: Find a sturdy building or a hard-topped vehicle as soon as possible. Avoid open fields and elevated areas.
- Avoid Tall Objects: Stay away from tall, isolated objects like trees, poles, and towers, which can attract lightning.
- Stay Away from Water: Do not swim, fish, or be near water bodies, as water is an
  excellent conductor of electricity.
- Crouch Low to the Ground: If no shelter is available, crouch down with as little of your body touching the ground as possible, minimizing contact points.
- Disperse Group: If you are in a group, spread out to reduce the chance of multiple injuries from a single strike.

#### Indoor Lightning Safety

- Avoid Water: Do not use sinks, showers, or any plumbing, as lightning can travel through pipes.
- Stay Away from Electrical Devices: Unplug appliances and avoid using wired electronics to prevent electrical surges.
- Use a mobile phone instead to avoid the risk posed by lightning traveling through phone lines.
- Avoid Windows and Doors: Stay clear of windows and doors to avoid potential strikes or broken glass from nearby lightning strikes.
- Avoid Touching Concrete Floors and Walls: Lightning can travel through the metal wires or bars in concrete walls or flooring.

#### Helping a Lightning Strike Victim

Lightning strike victims are safe to touch and do not carry an electrical charge, so render care immediately. Ensure you and the victim are both in a safe place, preferably indoors. Call 9-1-1. If trained, immediately begin CPR and use an AED if the person is unresponsive or not breathing. If using an AED, make sure you and the victim are not in a pool of water, as the charge from the AED shock can be carried through the water to the rescuer.
