LEAF AND YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Leaf Collection will begin by Zones beginning on November 12th. For your convenience, roads are listed below by the collection zones. Zone 1 may take upwards of two weeks, weather permitting. If your road is not listed in any of these zones, collection will commence following collection of Zone 3. The Road Crew will go through the Township a second time by zones beginning December 2nd, weather permitting.

Leaf Collection will be finished by December 13th, or with the first major snowfall.

Leaves should be raked into a pile at the curb, making sure leaves are not piled next to mailboxes or trees. <u>Please do not bag leaves!</u>

The Township will not pick-up bagged leaves. Keep storm sewer drains clear of leaves. Cars should not be parked over piles of leaves.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION –The Road Crew will be around the week of November 25th, 26th and 27th, BY REQUEST
ONLY! Please call 610-953-0016, during that week only, to let us know you have your yard waste bundled and ready for pick-up! Yard waste should be bundled, tied or placed in brown paper bags, no larger than 2'x2' and weighing no more than 20 pounds. No plastic bags, please!

If you miss Yard Waste Collection, bring yard waste and pile neatly next to the designated yard waste containers. We do not accept grass or leaves in yard waste containers!





Water will be turned off and bathrooms closed at all Township Parks on Wednesday, October 30th. Restrooms will remain open at Butch Boyer Memorial Pavilion in Amity Community Park.



Please keep sidewalks clear of basketball nets, trees, shrubs or other obstructions.



Amity Township has a drop off inside the office building for medications. Please do not put them in our drop slot alongside the building.

If you cannot come during business hours, please ring the police bell on the side of the front door and an officer will assist (if available) you with disposing of your medication.

Amity Twp Recycling Center Changes



Amity Township has installed a gate with a keypad to enter the recycling center. Residents must bring in their vehicle registration, driver's license and complete a form or complete the application online. A pin number will be given once the form is completed and signed.

Reminders:

- · The recycling center is only for Amity Township residents.
- Businesses and contractors are not permitted to the center.
- Anyone caught leaving items that are not permitted may lose access to the center and potentially face criminal prosecution.
- Access codes may not be shared with anyone else.

Yard Waste Items Permitted:

. Tree branches, shrubs, and leaves in paper bags.

Yard Waste Items NOT Permitted:

 Any items in plastic bags, grass clippings, dirt, stone, construction waste.

Recycling Overflow Dumpster (Green Bin) Items Permitted:

 Cardboard, empty glass containers, paper, empty metal cans, and plastic.

Recycling Overflow Dumpster Items NOT Permitted:

- Styrofoam and large items such as outdoor furniture or playsets.
- · Pizza boxes.

It may be best to keep your pets confined during trick-or-treating.




WRAPPERS






