
Sharing the Road Safely with School Buses.

- Never pass a bus from behind if it is stopped to load or unload children.
- If the yellow or red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended, traffic must stop.
- The area 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children; stop far enough to allow them space to safely enter and exit.
- Be alert; children are often unpredictable, and tend to ignore hazards and take risks.




TWO LANE

Vehicles traveling in both directions MUST stop.



MULTI-LANE PAVED ACROSS

Vehicles traveling in both directions MUST stop.



DIVIDED HIGHWAY

Unpaved space 5 ft+/raised median/physical barrier.
Vehicles behind bus MUST stop.
Vehicles traveling in the opposite direction must proceed with caution.

Know When to Stop for a School Bus

Mosquito Bite Prevention (United States)

Not all mosquitoes are the same. Different mosquitoes spread different viruses and bite at different times of the day.

Type of Mosquito	Viruses spread	Biting habits
 <i>Aedes aegypti</i> , <i>Aedes albopictus</i>	Chikungunya, Dengue, Zika	Primarily daytime, but can also bite at night
 <i>Culex</i> species	West Nile	Evening to morning

Use an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered insect repellent with one of the following active ingredients. When used as directed, EPA-registered insect repellents are proven safe and effective, even for pregnant and breastfeeding women.

Who is the Berks County MS4 Steering Committee?

The Berks County MS4 Steering Committee is an intergovernmental committee made of Berks County Municipalities and three Cooperative Education Partners which include the Berks County Planning Commission, Berks Nature and the Berks County Conservation District. The Cooperative Education partners and the municipalities work together to educate everyone on why clean stormwater is important.


What is a Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4)?

An MS4 is a state, city, town, borough, county, parish, district, association, or other public body that contains a drainage system which conveys only stormwater. The drainage system is made up of curbs, gutters, basins, storm pipes, ditches, swales and municipal streets. The system Does Not include pipes that convey sanitary sewer.

What is an MS4 Permit?

The MS4 Permit is designed to help reduce the discharge of pollutants from the regulated small MS4, to the maximum extent practical, to protect water quality, and to satisfy the appropriate water quality requirements of the Clean Water Act and the Pennsylvania Clean Streams Law. The permit requires the development and implementation of a Storm Water Management Program (SWMP). The SWMP features six Minimum Control Measures (MCMs). Each MCM requires implementation of specific Best Management Practices (BMPs) to meet measurable goals according to an approved schedule.

How implementation of the six minimum control measures happens:




MCM 1 Public Education and Outreach

The Berks County MS4 Steering Committee, including the education partners, work together to help educate the community about MS4 regulations and stormwater management.



MCM 2 Public Participation/Involvement

Berks County municipalities designated as MS4 regulated urbanized areas (either participating/not participating in the Berks MS4 Steering Committee) provide opportunities for residents and the public to become engaged with and help implement stormwater management practices. This could include public cleanup efforts, outreach efforts, and more.



MCM 3 Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination

Municipalities will implement strategies to monitor illicit discharges of substances or materials other than stormwater entering into storm sewer systems. This may include creating a storm sewer system map, creating an ordinance prohibiting illicit discharges, creating a plan to detect and address illicit discharges, and implementing an education program about the hazards associated with illicit discharges.



MCM 4 Construction Site Runoff Control

The Berks County Conservation District (BCCD) oversees the administration of NPDES permitting and compliance in the County. NPDES permits include plans to control for Erosion and Sediment associated with construction activities, which ensure that stormwater leaving construction sites and entering our watersheds is clean and clear.

MCM 5 Post-Construction Runoff Control


The Berks County Conservation District (BCCD) and municipalities oversee the permitting and construction of Post-Construction Stormwater Management (PCSM) plans. The Berks County Planning Commission provides review and comment of proposed storm water controls during their land development review process.



MCM 6 Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping

Municipalities continue to maintain and monitor the storm sewer system to be sure the system is functioning properly and prevent pollution events from occurring. Additionally municipal employees do regular training to fulfill permit requirements.

Household Hazardous Waste is any household product which is labeled:

CAUTION	DANGER
FLAMMABLE	EXPLOSIVE
TOXIC	WARNING
CORROSIVE	EXPLOSIVE
POISON	VOLATILE

or a combination of these characteristics. Look for warning or skull and crossbones on label. Use this list to identify and collect hazardous products which are no longer usable or wanted. Select a product suited for the job at hand but buy only what you can use entirely.

WHY COLLECT HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE?

These collection days are intended to provide Berks County residents with a responsible way to dispose of old, unusable and unwanted hazardous products. Putting them in the trash or down the drain contributes to the pollution of our air and drinking waters.

HOW TO BRING MATERIALS TO OUR COLLECTION SITE?

- Do not mix the materials
- Tighten lids on all containers. If containers are leaking, pack in larger containers
- Bring all materials in original containers with labels, if possible.
- If not in original labeled container, please label container used

- Gasoline

- Motor Oil

HOUSEHOLD

- Solvents
- Disinfectants
- Rug, Oven & Drain Cleaners
- Button Batteries
- Photographic Chemicals
- Floor & Furniture Polish
- Lithium & NiCad Batteries
- Fluorescent bulbs

DO NOT BRING

- **Latex Paint will not be accepted ***
- Joint & Caulking Compound
- Organic Peroxides
- Gas Cylinders
- Explosives & Ammunition
- Radioactive Waste
- Infectious or Medical Waste
- Water based sealants
- * Allow materials to dry and discard with regular trash.
Empty containers should be placed out with your regular trash.
