As camping season comes to an end, you may find yourself needing to unpack and clean your camper before winterizing. Pursuant to Ordinance #290, no recreational vehicle, motorized or non-motorized, such as campers, trailers, and boats, shall be parked on any street in the Township, with exception to the temporary purpose of loading and unloading such vehicles, for no more than 24 hours in each week (Sunday through Saturday).

Any person who parks a vehicle in violation of these provisions shall be subject to a fine of \$40.00. This fine can be assessed every 24 hours. Call 610-689-6002 to speak to an Officer on duty to report violators.

Back-to-School Safety for Drivers

When school starts, our roads get busier. There are more kids walking, biking, and waiting for buses. Every driver plays an important part in making sure they get to school safely. By slowing down, staying alert, and knowing the rules, you can help protect children in your community.



Driving Near School Buses

- Flashing yellow lights on a bus mean it is about to stop. Slow down and get ready to stop.
- Flashing red lights and a stop arm mean children are getting on or off. Stop at least 10 feet away and do not move until the lights stop flashing and the arm goes in.
- Never pass a stopped school bus.

Driving in School Zones

- Follow the posted speed limits.
- Watch for crossing guards and children in crosswalks.
- Put away distractions like your phone so you can focus on the road.
- Be especially careful near neighborhoods, parking lots, and bus stops.

When drivers, parents, and kids work together, we can make every school day a safe one.

Back-to-School: PA's School Bus Stopping Law

When you see a school bus with red lights flashing and the stop arm out, you must stop. This applies if you are behind the bus, driving toward it, or coming to an intersection where it is stopped.

Stay stopped until the lights stop flashing, the stop arm is pulled in, and all children are safely out of the roadway.

If there is a physical barrier, such as a grassy median or concrete divider, drivers on the opposite side do not need to stop.

Failing to follow the law can lead to serious penalties, including fines, points on your license, and even a suspension. Stopping for the bus is not just the law, it protects children every single school day.



Speeding in a school zone

(Title 75 section 3365)


When passing through a school zone, no person shall drive a vehicle at a greater speed than 15 miles per hour.

Overtaking or passing a school bus

(Title 75 section 3345)

Drivers of a vehicle shall stop at least 10 feet before reaching the school bus when the red signal lights are flashing and the side stop signal arms are activated.


Demographics of those cited for both violations:

Keystone State Challenge Academy Now Accepting Applications

The Keystone State Challenge Academy is now accepting applications for its January 2026 class. For the first time, prospective cadets can apply online through a simpler, faster process.

The program is free for Pennsylvania teens ages 16 to 18 who may be struggling in school and want a second chance at building a brighter future. Cadets live on campus for five and one-half months at Fort Indiantown Gap, where they focus on academics, leadership, job skills, community service, physical fitness and more. Meals, housing, uniforms and school supplies are all provided at no cost.

Applicants can check eligibility and apply online at pa.gov/ksca. Those who prefer a mailed application can call 717-861-7767 or 717-861-8831 or email RA-MVPACHALLENGE@pa.gov.

The online application was developed by the Commonwealth Office of Digital Experience in partnership with the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs to make the process easier and more accessible.

Quarterly sewer rates will be increasing by \$30.00, to \$201.00 with the January 1st bills.

As the Wastewater Treatment Plant upgrade continues to progress, the Township must raise rates again to offset the cost of the upgrades.

The Wastewater Treatment Plant was initially built back in 1975 and has reached the end of its useful life. The upgrade is about 50% complete and should be fully operational by March-April 2026.





If you've driven around the Township and noticed all the construction, you're not alone in wondering:

Can our roads handle the traffic? Where's the open space? What about our schools?

We cannot control what is submitted as Zoning dictates much of what transpires, and property owners are free to propose uses permitted in their respective zoning district. The township is required by law to allow all uses, somewhere. We do, however, have a review process in place.

How the Review Process Works

Once a plan is submitted, here's what happens behind the scenes:

1. The Township receives the application and reviews it for completeness.
2. It is distributed to our professional consultants (engineers, planners, legal) for review based on the code in place *at the time of submission*.
3. Within 30-90 days, those reviewers issue letters to the developer noting any concerns, required changes or code compliance issues.
4. The developer is then invited to a Planning Commission (PC) meeting, where our PC (an all-volunteer group) reviews the plan and residents can speak, ask questions, or express concerns.
5. If the plan doesn't meet code or seeks substantial waivers, the PC will likely not recommend approval. The developer must then revise and resubmit.
6. If the plan receives a positive recommendation, it goes before the Board of Supervisors for public discussion and, eventually, a vote.
7. If approved, that's just the preliminary plan (in some instances a minor plan may be reviewed as a preliminary/final meaning it would not go through a second review process). Final plan, construction, and project close-out stages often take years from start to finish.

How You Can Stay Involved

- Attend Planning Commission (2nd Thursday) and Board of Supervisor (3rd Wednesday) meetings. Agendas are placed on the website a day or 2 before each meeting.



What is a K9 Unit?

K9 units serve in a variety of roles, from local police departments to federal agencies, military operations, and private security firms. Their specialized skills make them an asset in operations that require sharp instincts, speed, and abilities no human can replicate—like detecting scents buried under layers of material or pursuing suspects through dense terrain. These dogs are partnered with human handlers, forming a team that trains, works, and often lives together.

Why K9 Units Matter

K9 units save lives, prevent crime, and provide skills that can't be duplicated by machines or people. From finding lost children to detecting hidden dangers, they play a critical role in community safety every single day.

Real-world success stories of K9s finding missing persons, uncovering hidden explosives, or helping apprehend violent criminals highlight their value. Behind every story is countless hours of work, dedication, and an unbreakable bond between handler and dog.

Popular Breeds Used in K9 Work

While any dog with the right drive and temperament *could* be trained for certain tasks, specific breeds have consistently proven successful in working roles:

- Belgian Malinois - Known for high energy, intelligence, and drive; a favorite for police and military.
- German Shepherds - Loyal, strong, and highly versatile.
- Dutch Shepherds - Agile, intelligent, and increasingly popular for detection and patrol.
- Labrador Retrievers - Especially common in detection roles due to their keen noses and friendly demeanor.
- Springer Spaniels - Used in explosives and narcotics detection, especially in airports and security settings.

Types of K9 Specialties

Working dogs are trained for specific duties depending on the needs of their department or agency. Here are some of the most common specialties:

🐾 Detection Dogs

These dogs are trained to use their extraordinary sense of smell to detect specific substances. Some of the most common detection roles include:

- Narcotics Detection (drugs)
- Explosives Detection
- Electronics Detection (like hidden USB drives)
- Human Remains Detection (HRD) for search and rescue or forensic work

🐾 Patrol Dogs

Also known as apprehension or protection dogs, these dogs assist in apprehending suspects. They are trained to control suspects through intimidation or by bite if necessary, always under the strict control of their handler.

🐾 Tracking Dogs

These dogs specialize in following scent trails, often used to find missing persons or track fleeing suspects over long distances or challenging terrain.

🐾 Search and Rescue (SAR) Dogs

SAR dogs work in disaster situations like collapsed buildings, natural disasters, or wilderness searches to locate people who are trapped, lost, or injured.

WHAT IS HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE?

Household Hazardous Waste is any household product which is labeled:

CAUTION	DANGER
FLAMMABLE	EXPLOSIVE
TOXIC	WARNING
CORROSIVE	EXPLOSIVE
POISON	VOLATILE

or a combination of these characteristics. Look for warning or skull and crossbones on label. Use this list to identify and collect hazardous products which are no longer usable or wanted. Select a product suited for the job at hand but buy only what you can use entirely.

WHY COLLECT HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE?

These collection days are intended to provide Berks County residents with a responsible way to dispose of old, unusable and unwanted hazardous products. Putting them in the trash or down the drain contributes to the pollution of our air and drinking waters.

HOW TO BRING MATERIALS TO OUR COLLECTION SITE?

- Do not mix the materials
- Tighten lids on all containers. If containers are leaking, pack in larger containers
- Bring all materials in original containers with labels, if possible.
- If not in original labeled container, please label container used

Risk is greater if a behavior is new or has increased, and if it seems related to a painful event, loss, or change

- Talking about or making plans for suicide.
- Acting anxious or agitated; behaving recklessly.
- Talking about being a burden to others.
- Talking about feeling trapped or in unbearable pain.
- Increasing the use of alcohol or drugs.
- Talking about feeling hopeless or having no reason to live.
- Sleeping too little or too much.
- Withdrawing or feeling isolated.
- Showing rage or talking about seeking revenge.
- Displaying extreme mood swings.
